<p>University of Utah representatives from Educational Psychology and Education/Special Ed programs.</p>			<p>Graduate programs in Educ Psychology/Counseling & Spec Education and Education Leadership and Policy. These programs have been going for approximately 1 year. Nursing has a strong presence in the U/U-DSC Center. Trying to create a structure to feed students out of the existing program at DSC and allow them to transfer credits into a Master’s program through U/U that they can get on-site in St. George. It’s a 30-hr non-licensure program . It’s a Masters in Education without out licensure in Special Ed. Our students could transfer 9 credits from our undergraduate program into their master’s program, thus reducing it down to a 21 hr. Master’s.</p> <p>Master’s of Educational Psychology with special emphasis in School Counseling. 48 credit hr master’s program that does lead to certification for a school counselor in the St. of Utah. Designed to prepare post-baccalaureate students from array of disciplines including Psychology, Communication, anybody who has an interest in helping professions who wants to get into the practice of counseling and advising but doesn’t necessarily want to pursue private practice or mental health therapy. But wants to help students in the Elementary and Secondary school environments. U/U faculty will be onsite during the summer.
