### **COURSE SYLLABUS, Fall SEMESTER 2006**

#### **Objectives**

At the conclusion of this course you be able to demonstrate the following:

- . Set up and properly operate the JVC KY-27 television camera.
- . Operate the Ross Switcher as a Technical Director
- . Operate a standard 16 channel audio board
- . Discuss the properties and operation of the Character Generator
- . Demonstrate a working knowledge of the computerized slow motion       replay machines.
- . Demonstrate a working knowledge of the digital video replay machines.

#### **Requirements**

Each student will:

- . Work at least 10 laboratory "shoots" as part of a live broadcasting crew. Each shoot will consist of the set up, operation and take down and storage of the equipment.
- . Attend at least 85% of all classroom instruction.
- . Complete a term paper, demonstrating original research, on a television employment position of your choice. The paper should include the requirements for obtaining the position and the entry level salary associated with that position. Paper should indicate whether or not this is a "real job" opportunity, at what station and whether or not the station is a top 50 market operation.

Because this is a performance class, much of your grade will be of a subjective nature.
