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- OBJECTIVE:**
1. To provide musical enrichment for the students of DSC.
 2. To help students develop techniques of expressive singing.
Students will learn correct posture, breathing, and vocalization along with working on songs to a performance level.
 3. Students will be introduced to different styles of music i.e. classical, Broadway, art, etc.

MUS 1810 is designed for those students who have never had private instruction before. Students will learn warm-ups for the voice and work on songs according to their proficiency. **MUS 2810** is for students with previous vocal instruction. **For MUS 2810 students, performance in the vocal recital given at the end of the semester is required.**

ATTENDANCE: Student's grades will be greatly influenced by his/her attendance. The instructor will make every reasonable effort to reschedule lessons due to illness or personal emergency if notification is received (preferably 24 hours) in advance. My home phone number is 628-1048. No lessons will be made up without advance notice of the absence. Lessons begin every half hour. If you are late your lesson will begin when you arrive and end on the half-hour, so as not to put everyone else behind schedule.

GRADE: The student's grade will be based on the effort and ability to display knowledge of concepts and literature being studied. Grades will be based on the instructor's evaluation of the student's progress over the semester. Attendance, preparation, tardiness, and attitude will be part of the evaluation. **For MUS 2810 students, performance in the vocal recital is required.**

TEXT: Vocal literature selected by the instructor to suit the level, needs and desire of the student. I would prefer that everyone have his or her own music. But since it is rather expensive and sometimes not available, I am willing to lend out mine on a temporary basis. However, you will be required to sign for the music you borrow and be responsible to return it in the condition that it is given to you.
