

## **VIOLIN PRIVATE LESSONS (Bonnie Romkey, Instructor)**

### **ONE CREDIT**

#### **COURSE OBJECTIVES:**

In this course, students will experience through studying appropriate repertoire and exercises:

1. **Accuracy** (intonation, rhythms, and dynamics)
2. **Technique** (posture with an emphasis on proper bow technique, finger agility and ease, relaxation and strength)
3. **Musicality** (including style, phrasing, interpretation, expression, and overall performance)
4. **Theory** (understanding and application of intervals, key and time signatures, rhythms, form and analysis)

#### **INSTRUCTIONAL MATERIALS:**

1. A ½-inch three ring binder for practice charts and loose music
2. Metronome
3. Any music or etude books recommended by the teacher

#### **CLASS PROCEDURES:**

Private classes are given at the instructor's studio: 1660 W. Sunset Blvd, #H-11. Students should enter the studio five minutes prior to lesson time, take out their violin and materials, and be ready to begin at their appointed time.

#### **GRADE EVALUATION:**

Students progress will be evaluated on their development of the concepts outlined in course objectives that will be emphasized during the individual lessons throughout the semester. Instructor will evaluate students on preparation at each lesson and performance.

#### **COURSE EVALUATION:**

1. Each student's weekly practice should be a minimum of six hours.
2. Each student must memorize a minimum of two pieces for the semester.
3. Student must perform in the studio recital.

#### **ATTENDANCE LEVEL:**

1. Attendance is very important for progression and is required.
2. Absences without notification to the instructor will result in a lowered grade.
3. In cases of a school-sponsored activity or serious illness, it is the student's responsibility to notify the instructor, as soon as possible, if they will be absent.
4. Make-up lessons will be given at the discretion of the instructor, given 12 hours notice.
5. The student is expected to be on time for all lessons.
