5. Enter your Pin Number which is your six-digit birthday (i.e. 010178 or your Banner Pin #)
6. Select Log In
7. Select the Student Services and Financial Aid
8. Select Student Records
9. Select Final Grades
10. Select Spring 2010 or the term you would like to view. Your grades will be displayed along with your current GPA and cumulative GPA

PREPARE FOR SUMMER TERM AND FALL SEMESTER REGISTRATION

It is often hard to think of another semester of school when one is finally ending, but now is a good time to beat the rush for registering for Summer Term or Fall Semester classes. Schedules for fall semester will be available on-line the first of April. **Registration for fall semester courses for SSS Students will begin April 11, and open registration will begin April 14.** The sooner you register for fall semester, the easier it will be. There aren't any closed classes this early. Fall Semester begins August 22.

Summer term has four options this year. There are two 5-week sessions, an 8-week term and one 14-week term. Summer term has a maximum credit hour limit of 12. This is due to the fact that classes are accelerated. Students will cover the regular semester course work in one-half the time. Summer is a great time to complete those classes that you feel you can successfully complete in five or eight weeks. If you need more time to master the concepts or process the information, this is NOT the time to take the course.
